The Story

Bart Laish (Sterling Hayden), a deserter from the United States cavalry, overtakes the remnants of a wagon train that has been attacked by Indians and finds, still alive but dying, Major Pepperis (Carleton Young), whom Laish knows. With his last breath the Major pleads with Laish to overtake the main train, and do what he can to get it to Fort Laramie. Laish dons the Major's uniform and when finally he does overtake the train he takes over command from Lieut. King (Keith Larsen), a young West Pointer, glad to be relieved. Helped by Carqueville (Jimmy Wakely), Sargeant Lybarger (John Pickard), Croshaw (Tom Tully) and other guides and non-coms, Laish drives the harassed emigrant train ahead in spite of attack after attack by the Indians, led by Chief Rasakura (Iron Eyes Cody). The bravery of one girl, Christella Burke (Coleen Gray), inspires Laish to new acts of heroism. Through Croshaw, Laish finally learns why the Indians are attacking. They are after a wagonload of contraband rifles being smuggled by Tillotson (Tudor Owen), the civilian leader of the train. Laish sacrifices the rifles. The Indians withdraw. Laish rides on his lonely way as the remnants of the train, with Christella and Lieut. King safe, gains the safety of the fort.
