

An exciting political thriller with romantic overtones reminiscent of early Hitchcock, American Roulette implicitly poses the question just how seriously it is meant to be taken. On the one hand there is the earnest theme of third-world tyranny, while on the other one keeps encountering clownish characters like Robert Stephens's raddled, cake-eating secret-service chappie and a pair of thoroughly farcical KGB agents. Followers of director Maurice Hatton's unorthodox career will know the answer already, for this is Hatton at his most intriguing, entertaining and playful as he takes us on a chase through London in the company of Carlos, a cute, poetry-writing Latin American president-in-exile threatened with assassination, and his beautiful blonde minder. Nice-looking American star Andy Garcia plays Carlos charismatically, and newcomer Kitty Aldridge is cool and classy as his running-mate.-Clyde Jeavons.
