

In the summer of 1941, bugler Robert E. Lee Prewitt (Montgomery Clift) transfers into an infantry outfit run by First Sergeant Milton Warden (Burt Lancaster), at Schofield Barracks, Honolulu. Prewitt, an excellent boxer, refuses to join the company boxing team and Warden is required by Capt. Dana Holmes (Philip Ober), to give him The Treatment, making his life as miserable as possible. Pvt. Angelo Maggio (Frank Sinatra) is the only one in the company to befriend Prewitt who falls in love with Lorene (Donna Reed), a hostess at the New Congress Club. Warden's one affair with Karen Holmes (Deborah Kerr), the Captain's wife, mounts to the point where she agrees to divorce the officer and wed Warden. Maggio goes AWOL and is brutally beaten in a prison stockade, dying in Prewitt's arms. In a fierce fight, Prewitt kills the man responsible. Gravely wounded himself, Prewitt finds sanctuary with Lorene. The attack on Pearl Harbor finds Warden in his element—a professional soldier at war. Prewitt, another professional soldier, is killed while trying to get back to Warden and the war. Karen and Lorene meet on a homebound boat, each knowing she has lost the man she loved.

"From Here to Eternity," James Jones' powerful prizewinning novel that created a sensation when published, has been transformed by Columbia Pictures into the motion picture eagerly awaited by millions and due on the screen of able characters are enacted by a star-studded cast that includes Burt Lancaster as Sergeant Warden; Montgomery Clift as Prewitt; Deborah Kerr as Karen; Frank Sinatra as Maggio and Donna Reed as Lorene.

As a novel, an epic saga of a group of pre-Pearl Harbor professional soldiers - their lives, loves and fights-"From Here to Eternity" is said to be much more than that in its pictorial rendition. Directed by Fred Zinnemann, the magnificent new movie reportedly is compounded out of the universal elements of life itself-courage, brutality, love.

In "From Here to Eternity," Clift, a young soldier who loves the Army, transfers to an infantry outfit stationed at Schofield Barracks in Honolulu. Although a tough and able soldier, Clift has an unregimented and independent streak in him. He refuses when he is asked to join the company boxing team by his commanding officer who hopes, thereby, to advance his own career by producing a championship team. Grounds for this refusal is that he once blinded his best friend while sparring with him. For this, Clift is given The Treatment, a steady round of brutal harassment.

Clift's stubborn refusal to surrender to The Treatment arouses the reluctant admiration of the company's top sergeant, played by Lancaster, himself a professional soldier able and willing to live with the system as he understands it. The sergeant's liking for the indomitable courage of the young soldier carries over, into his own illicit affair with the captain's unhappy wife, sweaterclad Deborah Kerr, helping to transform it from the unthinking and casual thing it is into a real, purposeful romance. Clift, too, finds romance, with Donna Reed who portrays a friendly hostess in a Honolulu social club and whose plans for her own future include no entanglement with an Army 30-year man.


The constant goading to which he is subject finally forces Clift to turn upon his tormentors; he whips one of them in a brutal fist fight. Still shaken by the anger and bitterness he has so long held down, he then goes hunting for the sadistic sergeant of a military stockade, responsible for the death of his only friend, the likable Pvt. Maggio played by Frank Sinatra. Killing the man in another all-out fight, Clift finds sanctuary with his girl while Lancaster, as top sergeant, does what he can to cover up for him. The "sneak" attack on Pearl Harbor is the culminating incident of the film.

In "From Here to Eternity" perhaps never have so many stars been given so many outstanding parts. Lancaster, who proved that

he was more than a great action star with his solid performing in "Come Back, Little Sheba," reportedly is in his element as the man of action who is faced with a personal crisis. Clift, as the sensitive, stubborn young soldier who fights against the ruthless Treatment, is said to be perfectly cast. Miss Kerr, advance reports reveal, comes up with a change of pace as the officer's glamor wife, and Miss Reed, up till now continuously cast as a sweet young woman, is also said to reveal new resources as an actress in her current role. Sinatra gets in an off-beat assignment as the wild, exuberant Maggio; he also has been hailed as sensational in his role.

"From Here to Eternity" was partly filmed on location in Hawaii. Appearing in the film are such landmarks as Schofield Barracks, the Royal Hawaiian Hotel, Waikiki Beach, Honolulu Valley and Beach, Diamond Head and the Waialae Golf Course.

Daniel Taradash wrote the screen play, based on Jones' novel, which was directed by Zinemann for producer Buddy Adler.

'Eternity' Gives Lancaster Impassioned Action Role

When ex-acrobat and present action star Burt Lancaster was cast in the intensely dramatic film, "Come Back, Lttle Sheba," Hollywood had its doubts. So Shirley Booth walked off with a Best Actress award for her work in the film, tough competition for any actor, but Lancaster proved the acting surprise of the year, coming up with what is universally regarded as one of the year's finest male performances.

Now, in Columbia Pictures' out-

standing motion picture version of James Jones' powerful bestselling novel, "From Here to Eternity," also starring Montgomery Clift, Deborah Kerr, Frank Sinatra and Donna Reed at the Theatre, Lancaster has what may be his best role to date. As the tremendous figure of Sergeant Warden, dedicated to his infantry company and the man who really runs it despite the fiction of an officer over him, Lancaster has come up with an arresting portrayal. Superb in his role as a leader of men, Lancaster's characterization is complicated by his mad infatuation for the attractive wife of his commanding officer, played by Deborah Kerr.

Lancaster launched his career when, an obscure acrobat, he appeared briefly in the short-lived Broadway play, "A Sound of Hunting." But his impressive performance in the play earned him a screen test which won him a movie contract from film producer Hal Wallace. The key role in "The Killers" won him Hollywood stardom. As a result of his work in such pictures as "Sorry, Wrong Number," "Flame and the Arrow," "Ten Tall Men" and "Come Back, Little Sheba," Lancaster has become one of Hollywood's top movie males.

The screen play of "From Here to Eternity," based on the intensely human pages of the most daring book of our time, was written by Daniel Taradash. Fred Zinnemann, director of "High Noon" also directed "From Here to Eternity" and Buddy Adler produced.

Clift's Work in 'Eternity' Involved Varied Skills

"Acting before the cameras is a cinch compared to all the preproduction training required for a role," declares Montgomery Clift.

The handsome young actor, who is currently playing the part of Prewitt, the unregimented and spirited G.I. in Columbia's movie version of James Jones' best-selling novel, "From Here to Eternity," at the Theatre, got his first good rest in a month when the film actually started shooting. The all-star cast of "From Here to Eternity" also includes Burt Lancaster, Deborah Reed.

For his role as the regular Army soldier, Clift is called upon to perform as an expert boxer, bugler, rifleman and pool player. He even has to sing in the picture.

Clift's strenuous regimen to prepare him for his demanding role as the tough recalcitrant G.I. started off with road work. He then reported to former welterweight boxing champ Mushy Callahan at a gym where he worked out on the punching bag, weights and other body-building devices to develop his muscles, and then boxed a few rounds. Supposedly a first-class Army pugilist, Clift in the film knocks out a heavyweight who has been bullying him. And it had to look authentic for the cameras!

After a light lunch, Clift spent three hours with a master sergeant who drilled him in the manual of arms with a 1903 Springfield rifle (the weapon used during the period of the story), including the break-down and assembling procedure which Clift has to perform in a few seconds, use of the bayonet, and close quarter knife-fighting.

The next few hours were spent in Columbia's music department where music director Morris Stoloff gave Monty some singing les-Kerr, Frank Sinatra and Donna sons and trumpeter Manny Klein explained the fine points of bugling. Clift is supposed to be good enough to blow "taps" at Arlington Cemetery.

> The exhaustive day was finally terminated at a Hollywood pool room where an expert taught the actor how to make with the cue and balls for a scene in an army recreation room where Clift racks up a few. In addition, of course, he had to learn close-order drill, the salute and the many other rounds of the U.S. soldier.

'Eternity' Is a Screen Masterpiece!

Jones' powerful and savage prize-winning novel, brought to the screen via Daniel Taradash's magnificent screen play and Fred Zinneman's whiplash direction under the production aegis of Buddy Adler, "From Here to Eternity" is magnificently created out of the elements of life itself: courage, brutality, love.

Set in the Pearl Harbor of 1941, in the months prior to and culminating with the sneak attack, "From Here to Eternity" is a compelling study of both the professional soldier — America's 30-year man—and of overwhelming romance. In fact, two romances and two professional soldiers strangely joined in friendship and conflict.

First of the soldiers is Robert E. Lee Prewitt, a bugler who once played "Taps" at Arlington Cemetery, who transfers into an infantry outfit in Schofield Barracks, Honolulu, run by First Sergeant Milton Warden. Professional soldiers both, the two find much to like and respect in each other but they cannot continue as friends when the company commander forces the sergeant to give Prewitt, a brilliant boxer who once had blinded a GI in a sparring match, The Treatment, making his life miserable as possible, for his refusal to join the company boxing team. Likable Pvt.

Angelo Maggio remains the brooding, sensitive Prewitt's only friend.


It is Maggio who introduces Prewitt to Lorene, a young lady who helps Prewitt stand up against the mounting intensity and crudeness of The Treatment, and who shelters him when, in a bloody knife battle, he kills a stockade sergeant responsible for the death of Maggio. Against this impassioned story of a soldier and his girl is told, in "From Here to Eternity," the equally bitter and moving romance which couples Warden and Karen Holmes, wife of the brutal company commander. First an accidental and unthinking affair, they gradually move to the point of real romance, with talk of divorce and marriage.

The attack on Pearl Harbor brings both affairs to an end. Warden resumes his rightful role as a leader of men, directing them with authority and skill. The fugitive Prewitt, professional soldier, attempts to rejoin his outfit and Warden, and is killed.

Perfect casting marks "From Here to Eternity." Lancaster is superb in his dramatic role, making Sergeant Warden a vivid, well-rounded representation of the pre-war professional soldier, a man at home in any situation, bound by the rules but capable of breaking them. Clift is equally fine as the brooding, proud young bugler who is perfectly willing to fight - but not for the sake of fighting. Deborah Kerr abandons her hitherto regal and proper characterizations to appear as the lush, sweater-clad and unhappy Army wife whose chance amour with her husband's first sergeant turns into something unexpected but understandable. Donna Reed, too, breaks with her motion picture past to play the somewhat tarnished Lorene whose plans for the future had no room for romance with a soldier. Frank Sinatra is equally fine in a straight dramatic role as the likable Pvt. Maggio, a little guy with a heart.

Sinatra Sought and Won Off-Beat 'Eternity' Role

The story of how Frank Sinatra, that extraordinary crooner known to millions as the Voice, snagged one of the outstanding dramatic roles of the year in Columbia Pictures' all-star version of the best-selling novel, "From Here to Eternity," now at the Theatre, makes one of the most exciting sagas to come out of Hollywood in years. Burt Lancaster, Montgomery Clift, Deborah Kerr and Donna Reed are also starred in "From Here to Eternity."

It's a well-known Hollywood truism that any actor worth his salt is constantly on the lookout for his dream role, a part that he feels would fit him like a glove. Ever since Frank Sinatra first read James Jones' powerful novel, "From Here to Eternity," he dreamed of playing the part of peppery Private Maggio, the likable little soldier who made people want to cry when they laughed at him.

"When it was announced Columbia had purchased the movie rights, I immediately contacted the studio," says Sinatra. "I spoke with producer Buddy Adler, the casting department, as many executives as I could badger and, in fact, any one else who would listen to me. Of course, I realized that production was a long way off and that a script was just being written, but I wanted to get in first licks. I didn't even send my agent in to pitch for me.

"I followed the news releases religiously. First, Montgomery Clift was signed and then Fred Zinnemann, the director. Then Burt Lancaster and Deborah Kerr and Donna Reed. I kept hounding the studio constantly. I wanted that part real bad. But I was getting nowhere. Finally, I gave

up and flew to Nairobi, Africa, to be with my wife who was on film location, and it was there I received a cable to report to Columbia for a screen test. I was scared to death. When the test was over I flew right back to Africa. Months went by and I didn't hear a word about the test. I knew other actors were also being considered. At last, in London, word came that the part was mine. You can imagine how I felt. The role which I had dreamed of playing for two years was mine at last."

Donna Reed, in 'Eternity,' Is Nice to All the Boys

Unlike those prophets who are without honor in their own country, movie star Donna Reed is held in high regard by Columbia Pictures, her home studio. Miss Reed was given the nod by Columbia executives for the most coveted feminine role in many years, that of Lorene, the girl who is nice to all the boys, in Columbia's "From Here to Eternity," exciting filmization of James Jones' powerful best-selling novel now showing at the Theatre. The new film's all-star cast includes, besides Miss Reed, Burt Lancaster, Montgomery Clift, Deborah Kerr, and Frank Sinatra.

Nothing was further from Donna's thoughts when she left the small Iowa home town of Denison than becoming a movie star. When she reached high school, she was elected Campus Queen and she got her first taste of the theatre by starring in the school presentation of "The Night of January 16." When, a year later, she left Denison and went to live with an aunt in Los Angeles, she trained for a business career in that city's municipal college and also appeared in two school plays, "The Intruder" and "The Happy Journey." At this point her penchant for being elected Campus Queen was duplicated at the college. Within 24 hours, she received offers for screen tests from three different studios.

Being of a practical turn of mind, Miss Reed turned them all down because she had not yet received her business school diploma as a qualified stenographer. Immediately after being graduated, however, she made a test with Van Heflin, himself newly arrived from the Broadway stage. Both were signed to contracts. Two days later she was assigned to her first picture.

'From Here to Eternity' Filmed in Hawaii Locales

Far more difficult than re-creating the dead past for movie audiences is the problem that Hollywood faces when it attempts to resurrect on the screen an era or period which has been personally experienced by many of the potential viewers of the film in question. In reviving the distant past on the screen, only the rare expert will be able to detect the occasional discrepancy that may crop up. But woe betide the hapless producer who allows an incorrect prop to creep into a picture placed in a period familiar to millions.

In bringing to the screen the exciting picturization of James Jones' "From Here to Eeternity," now at the Theatre with an all-star cast including Burt Lancaster, Montgomery Clift, Deborah Kerr, Frank Sinatra and Donna Reed, Columbia Pictures had to keep a keen eye cocked for the many millions of people who lived through the period immediately preceding the attack on Pearl Harbor by the Japanese.

Since the period of the story involves the transitional Army uniform and weapons between World Wars I and II, wardrobe and props had to be strictly authentic.

Cld-style Army clothing for 400 men such as canvas leggings, campaign hats, blue two-piece fatigues with pullover top and out-of-date cap, and flat steel helmets had to be obtained, packed and shipped to Hawaii, where the picture was filmed. Also, 400 1903 Springfield rifles, 20 Thompson sub-machine guns, 20 BAR's, 15 .45 pistols and approximately 55,000 rounds of ammunition were shipped.

All exteriors of "From Here to Eternity" were photographed at the identical locale of the novel, with approximately three weeks of shooting at Schofield Barracks, the Royal Hawaiian Hotel, Waikiki Beach, Honolulu Valley and Beach, Diamond Head, and in the streets of Honolulu and on the Waialae Golf Course.

The historic strafing of Schofield Barracks by Japanese "Zeroes" while making their bombing runs on Navy ships, was filmed at the locale of the disaster. A group of planes of 199th Squadron, Hawaii Air National Guard, bearing the familiar red insignia of the Japanese fighters, participated in the simulated attack in the mock battle scenes featuring Lancaster, and 800 men of the Hawaii Infantry Training Center.







Show him how to set up window and counter displays tied up to your picture. Make liberal use of the line "Read the Book . . . See the Movie!" in addition to stills, ads and poster art.

LUCKY PAGES: Place a copy of the book on display in your lobby with one or more pages marked at random. Offer guest tickets to any person opening the book to a lucky page. Only one try to a person.



- 1) Set up "blonde and brunette" displays for keynoting windows and ad layouts in cooperating stores which group merchandise for blondes around stills of Miss Kerr and merchandise for brunettes around stills of Miss Reed. Ad lines might be along the angle: "Fashions to Fit Blonde or Brunette . . . 'From Here to Eternity' . . ."
- 2) Stage a contest for male patrons who write-in 50-word answers to the question: "Whom Would You Rather Have From Here to Eternity—Blonde Deborah Kerr or Brunette Donna Reed?" Work it on TV, radio or newspaper sponsorship or in your own theatre with guest tickets as prizes.
- 3) Send a play-suited blonde and brunette pair through the main business and shopping streets. Signs on their backs call attention to the film and your playdate.

LOVE AT FIRST SIGHT

Donna Reed plays the type of girl with whom Montgomery Clift can—and does!—fall in love at first sight. Make this the basis for the following:

CONTEST: Offer guest tickets and promoted merchandise prizes for the best answers, in 50 words or less, to the question: "Do You Believe in Love at First Sight?"

DISPLAY: Make up a 40" x 60" display featuring stills of Miss Reed and the copy: "Men! You'll Fall in Love at First Sight With Donna Reed in From Here to Eternity'!"

REPORTER: Plant the question—with credits, of course!—"Do You Believe in Love at First Sight?" in inquiring reporter column or on a local radio or TV audience participation show. Go after men-women forums in addition to the shows above.

GO AFTER WIVES

Deborah Kerr appears in the film as an unhappy wife who finds romance with Burt Lancaster. Use this situation to go after the wives in your community:

LETTERS: Work with newspaper columnist, radio or TV program for write-in letters on the subject: "Should a Wife Remain Faithful?" Cite the film situation in asking for 50-word letters, with guest tickets for opening day and promoted merchandise going to the best answers.

PEEP BOX: Set up a lobby peep-box, u s i n g stills of Deborah Kerr and Burt Lancaster, and the line: "Wives! Would You Do What Deborah Kerr Does in From Here to Eternity'?"

BALLY: Send a "bride and groom" through main streets with the sign: "It's Love From Here to Eternity'." Add playdate information.




"From Here to Eternity" is a provocative title, and it can be put to work in contests and dealer promotions. The origin of the title, its meaning, and its value as an expression of superiority all should be stressed in showmanship. Work the following:

"From Here to Eternity" conjures up endless meanings and feelings, making it a natural subject for contests around "What Does From Here to Eternity' Mean to Me?" and "Where Does the Phrase Come From?" TV and radio panel and quiz programs should go for these contests because of the widespread interest in the book. Answers to the first question should be submitted in 25- or 50-word letters to the cooperating newspaper, radio or TV station. Answers to "Where Does the Phrase Come From?" should be judged on the basis of accuracy. (The title comes from the second line of Rudyard Kipling's Barrack Room Ballad, "Gentleman Rankers," which has also been put to music in Yale's "Whiffenpoof Song.") Promoted merchandise gifts and guest tickets to your showing of "From Here to Eternity" might be awarded the authors of the best 25 letters on the first question and the first 25 correct ones on the second subject.

MERCHANDISING: Sell the title as a merchandising slogan for stores. It lends itself to the claim: "No Greater Values From Here to Eternity!" Vary this theme: "No Finer Furs From Here to Eternity!," "No Better Cuisine," "No Lovelier Gowns," etc., always ending the dealer message with your own: "No Greater Entertainment 'From Here to Eternity'!"





Give Film All-Out Opening It Merits!

Go all-out in making your opening day as exciting and as memorable as the picture itself! Invest your playdate of "From Here to Eternity" with the local "name" values, with excitement and pagentry! Here's how:

- Send out special invitations to the town's most newsworthy "names," as well as to the editors, radio and TV personalities and others who can keep the title prominent!
- Cover your opening with a radio or TV broadcast, and see to it that newspaper photographers are also present and working! There should be plenty of police on hand to see to it that the people milling about your theatre, attracted by the going-on, are kept in order.
- As soon as it gets dark, turn on the kleig lights to make it a "Hollywood opening" in a very real sense! Make effective use of the bugle ballyhoo described below!
- Work with the downtown businessmen—especially the restaurants-in special campaigns. Point out that the more people attracted to your neighborhood by "From Here to Eternity," the greater the benefit to the merchants!

Let Bugles Tell Em All About It!

In "From Here to Eternity," a bugle figures importantly in the Montgomery Clift characterization. Use this angle to blow your own horn! Spot Still Nos. 90, 114 and 153 in all "bugle" showmanship.

- 1\ Arrange with Boy Scouts or members of organized bands to blow assembly or similar bugle calls in key parts of the city, coincident with the start of each show at your theatre. Publicize the stunt through press and radio and announce it on a poster beside each bugler. Suggested copy: "Calling All Moviegoers!—'From Here to Eternity'-State Theatre Now!" Be sure to station a bugler out front. Between regular calls, he might play the two songs from the picture (see page 13).
- Add a bugle contest to this ballyhoo. Have the general public blow a bugle in your lobby in a bugle competition judged every day by a different musical authority such as a music critic, a nightclub band star or an official of the school music department. Hold finals on stage opening night. Get music store to sponsor contest, offer prizes. Approach radio-TV stations on possibilities of holding bugle contest, too.
- Get bugle features on disc jockey programs. Suggest an allbugle program made up of the town's best playing in appreciation of the tribute paid them by "From Here to Eternity."
