

SYNOPSIS

(Not for Publication)

Henri Ferret (JEAN GABIN) returns to France from America, where he worked with the American gangster, "Big" Rosillo. He joins up with Liski (DALIO), French drug boss, who needs a "strong man" lieutenant to keep his far-flung narcotics syndicate "in line." Liski arranges for Ferret to open a cafe, Le Troquet, as a front for the police. The staff for the cafe includes a pretty cashier, Lisette (MAGALI NOEL), who soon becomes Ferret's mistress.

Ferret's work in France now begins. Mimile, a railway employee and "carrier" of drugs for the syndicate, decides to quit. He is liquidated by the syndicate's hired killers, "The Catalan" (LINO VENTURA) and Bibi (ALBERT REMY). Ferret meets Birot (ARMONTEL), chemist working for the gang, who refines the drugs from their raw state (opium, heroin, morphine, etc.), and Birot's wife, Solange (JACQUELINE POREL). Marcel, another "carrier" who crosses the gang, is also liquidated, whereas Li-Chang, who runs an opium joint supplied by the gang, is roughed up so that he understands he must increase his purchases of the stuff.

Liski becomes worried when the police grab a huge shipment of heroin in Le Havre and even Ferret is beginning to be suspected by him of defecting, like so many of the others. One pusher, Lea (LILA KEDROVA), herself a drug addict, shows Ferret how the traffickers work in various places—opium and marijuana joints, small bistros, caferestaurants, subways, etc.—but she becomes too unreliable in her frequent candid outbursts, and is marked for liquidation by Liski via his paid assassins. The police, informed of the attempt to wipe out the pathetic Lea, lie in wait for the killers. An encounter with them leaves two of the police dead, with the pair of thugs on the lam.

Seeking refuge in Ferret's cafe, they demand he take them to Liski who has to help them out of the mess that he engineered. Liski gives them keys to a hideaway in the suburbs and Ferret drives them there.

Again the police have somehow been notified. Soon the narcotics squad has the house surrounded. The two killers decide to shoot it out. But their implacable enemy is not only outside, but also inside the chateau with them... Henri Ferret....

In a general "razzia," everybody, including Liski, is rounded up.
But is he the real head? And will this same pattern of violence and
drug trafficking go on despite this latest crackdown?

While Ferret's romance with Lisette blossoms in this violent milieu, there is a raid by the narcotics squad on Ferrat's cafe, and he is briefly held along with the others rounded up there.

EXPLOITATION

Stress "No One Seated During Last 15 Minutes."

SELL "NO SEATING during last 15 minutes" in your publicity in the press and on the air-AND STICK TO THE POLICY. Patrons will be all the more enticed if they are kept waiting in line, rather than allowed in during the last 15 minutes of the feature.

CONTACT YOUR LOCAL DISK JOCKEYS and ask them to play Rayven's "La Chnouf," which is the theme music of "Razzia" (original title, "Razzia sur la chnouf"). Disk jockeys have received six different recordings of it, by the following artists on the indicated labels: Les Elgart (Columbia), Ray Bloch (Coral), Leo Souris (Decca), Eddie Barclay and Ralph Marterie (Mercury), and Coleman Hawkins (Vik).






