JANE

At the 1986 Cannes Film Festival Jane
Campion made an unprecedented debut.
A record four films were invited for
participation in official events. Her three short
films were made while she was a student at
the Australian Film and TV School. They are
all distinguished by a mischievous sense of
comic irony. Campion is a stylist whose
humour is dry, painful and throwaway.

"In Australia, where inflated myth-making and large gestures are the prevailing mode in film, it takes a bit of nerve to keep working back towards the plain, the daily, the simple, the small mysteries of ordinary life...

Her work looks simple but it is dense. Her approach is oblique and subtle. The tone of her work manages to be both intimate and discreet. She knows how to use inanimate objects – a shoe, a chair, a curtain – to suggest a whole range of emotion which she refuses to spell out in dialogue. She expects the viewer to do some work, and she makes that work a pleasure."
