This edition of ASSUNTA SPINA has been made from a positive tinted nitrate of the period released by Caesar Film, with original intertitles in Portugese, and preserved at the Cinemateca Brasileira of Sao Paolo, under the title Sangue Napolitano, and a lavender safety print, made in the 1960s from the original negative without intertitles, preserved at the Cineteca Italiano in Milan.

The restoration premiered at L'Immagine Ritrovata in Bologna in November 1993.

The film's colors have been restored to their original hues by using the methods of Noel Desmet of the Cinematheque Belge.
