MISTER 880 is the number of an unclosed file on counterfeiting in the records of the U. S. Secret Service. It applies also to the quaint, but unsuspected character who has been passing "queer" dollar bills around New York for years. When S.S. agent Burt Lancaster, with the help of Dorothy McGuire, finally runs him down, the counterfeiter turns out to be odd and lovable little Edmund Gwenn.







THE SLEEPING CITY is a semi-documentary film photographed in New York and told with the impact of "The Naked City." Richard Conte is seen as a member of an undercover police squad whose job is to track down a dangerous group of criminals.



LORNA DOONE re-creates the time of Cromwell and Charles II, from the pages of the famous English classic, with beauteous Barbara Hale in the title role of the Technicolor production. It is a cloak and dagger story in the best tradition, with Richard Greene as the stalwart hero.


