Willie Stark (Broderick Crawford), dynamic backwoods personality, uses big-city political tricks to become elected Governor. He is aided into the Governor's mansion by Jack Burden (John Ireland), a reporter, and Sadie Burke (Mercedes McCambridge) his political-wise secretary. His magnetic power even attracts Jack's girl, Anne (Joanne Dru).

Willie inaugurates an administration of reckless corruption. He becomes alienated from his wife Lucy (Anne Seymour) and is instrumental in having his son (John Derek) crippled for life. These incidents cause him to lose the support of Anne's uncle, Judge Stanton.

Willie tries to blackmail the Judge but Stanton, rather than face exposure, commits suicide. Dr. Stanton (Shepperd Strudwick), Anne's brother, kills Willie when he learns of their affair. This ends the Willie Stark legend.
