Strangely Dougherty is out of shape and Eddie, the newsboy, knocks him out then finds that his manager, Lou (Ernest Sefton) has bribed Toots (Eve Gray) to keep Joe out of training as much as possible. Eddie knocks Lou out as well - and arranges a rematch.

He finds that the financier has swindled Sylvia (Eve Gray), but that his firm is on the verge of bankruptcy. By sheer luck, Reggie corrects the situation, saves the firm and wins Sylvia.
