Soviet 'Hamlet' Will Open Film Festival Here Tonight

The Soviet film of "Hamlet," with Innokenti Smoktunovski in the title role of the Shakespeare drama, will open the second annual New York Film Festival in Philharmonic Hall at Lincoln Center tonight.

The drama, adapted by the late Russian poet-novelist, Boris Pasternak, has a musical background score composed by Dimitri Shostakovich and was directed by Grigori Kozintsev, who will be among the celebrities attending the screening at 9 o'clock.

A festival spokesman reported that tonight's showing would be before "a capacity or close to a capacity audience." The festival, which will run through Sept. 26, will present new features from 11 countries, including the United States, and short subjects from here and abroad.
