"(...) The environment and the narrative resembles that of HETS. In HETS, everything was viewed from the perspective of the young man; like Bo [in LAST COUPLE OUT], he was a desperado, but one who survived his crisis without learning more about the older generation than that they ruthlessly clung to their power.

LAST COUPLE OUT has not altered the young man's fear of adults' betrayal, and has also added a common middle-age dilemma. The grown-ups have renounced a great deal of the dictatorship they held over their children and therefore can no longer hide their own weaknesses. Yet their almost adult children don't want to, cannot or dare not face the truth."
